Public Information (P.I.)

Cooperation with the Professional Community (C.P.C.)

Join passionate AA members in carrying the message to local nonalcoholics.

When we stand to serve, alcoholics may be reached who might otherwise never find the program, or they may be reached sooner with the help of informed non-A.A.s.

P.I. can effectively communicate A.A. principles to the general public and to representatives of the media. The committee also connects with doctors, members of the clergy, law enforcement officers, employers, public service workers, and others who deal with active alcoholics.

Examples of Public Information (P.I.)

- :: Respond to speaking/ interview requests from Press, Radio, TV and Internet entities.
- :: Host a Community Meeting about Alcoholics Anonymous.
- :: Place cards and signs in telephone offices, police stations, sheriffs' offices, hospitals, county infirmaries, hotels, and taxi stations.

C.P.C. will inform and meet with those who have contact with alcoholics through their profession about where we are, what we are, what we can do, and what we cannot do. Professional groups include healthcare, E.A.P. and H.R. professionals; educators; members of the clergy; lawyers; social workers; military professionals; government officials; and those working in the field of alcoholism.

Examples of Cooperation with Professional Community (CPC)

- :: Write letters to professionals.
- :: Offer presentations and/or investigate opportunities to have an A.A table/exhibit at non-AA meetings or conferences with professionals.
- :: Answer questions as a panel member (attend Mock panel training.)

All Positions Remain Anonymous
